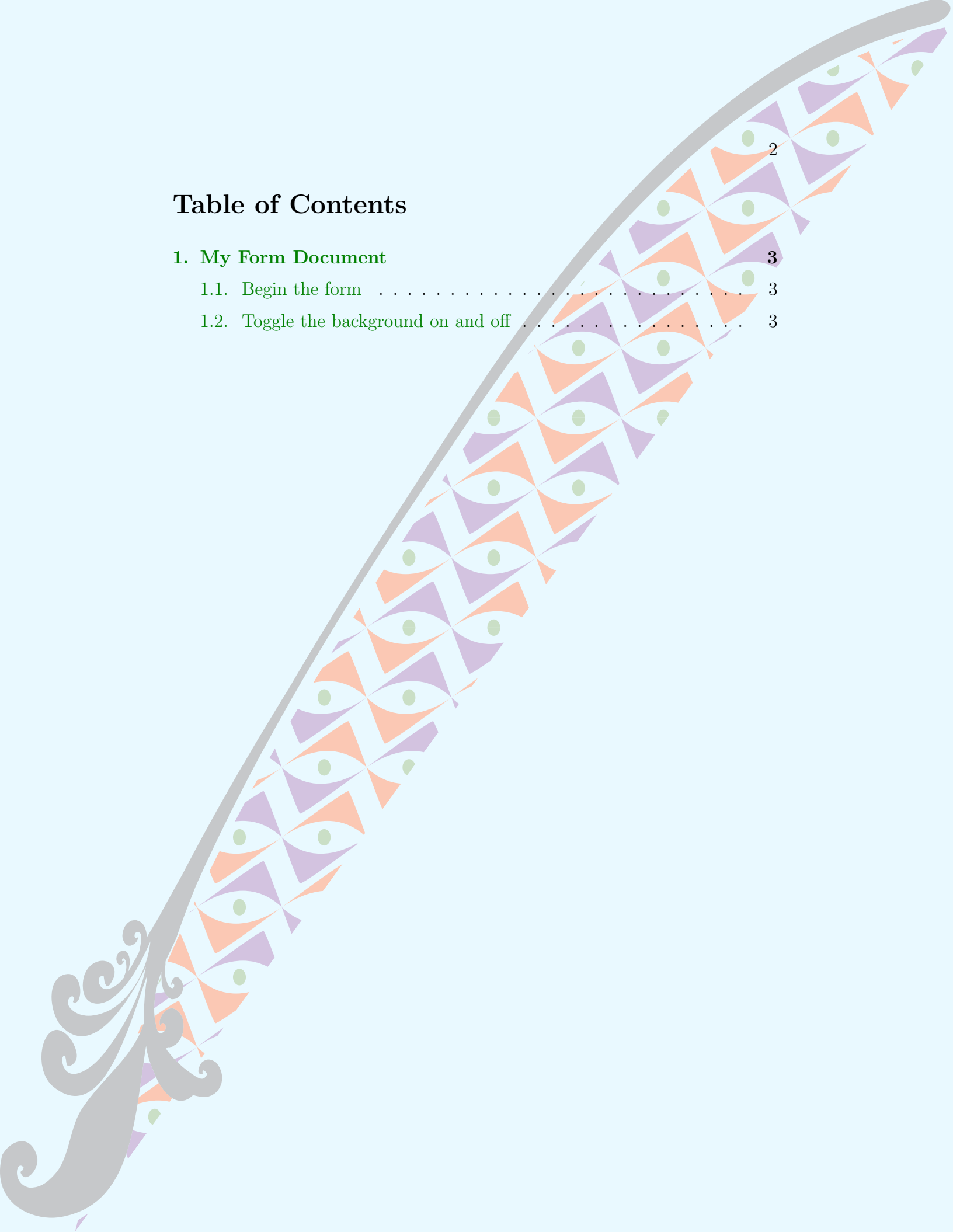

1 My Form Document

I've been experimenting with putting background color (and graphics) in a separate layer, so they can be made invisible.
